Every 1 was inspired by the powerful words of Pope Francis, who reminded us that the Church - and by extension, our communities - are open to everyone. His call for inclusion and harmony resonates deeply in Macao, a city shaped by diversity and shared humanity. This exhibition honours that vision, celebrating both the beauty of togetherness and the value of each individual story within the collective whole.

The title Every 1 holds layers of meaning. It speaks of unity, of "everyone" as a community bound by shared experiences and connections. Yet, it also emphasises individuality - "everyone" as a unique person with their own light and story. This exhibition explores that tension, where the universal and the particular meet, reminding us that the strength of the whole lies in valuing the distinctiveness of its parts.

Every 1 is an exciting film screening, with 5 short films directed and produced by emerging local filmmakers: our students. These films offer intimate glimpses into the lives and stories of Macau's people, capturing the spirit of connection in deeply personal ways.

Every 1 is an immersive, interactive experience that blurs the boundaries between art and technology. Featuring works by 14 talented young local artists, graduate students of Communication and Media, it invites the audience to experience Macao's communities through photography, film, and dynamic installations.

These pieces don't just tell stories - they invite you to participate, to reflect, and to connect. This exhibition is alive! It bridges tradition and innovation, art and technology, an invitation to step into the heart of Macao's vibrant and harmonious spirit.


IAO KIN KAM, TOMMY

This video follows a teenager on a journey of self-definition and understanding. Through the lens of his reflections, the narrative explores profound questions about the meaning of reading and life itself. The protagonist recalls his middle school experiences, where he grappled with these concepts, often answering the teacher's mathematical prompts, such as "1+1=?" - as a metaphor for deeper truths. This creative approach invites viewers to engage with the complexities of growth, knowledge, and the quest for meaning in their lives.

"Anteambulo" is an interactive video art experience in a vintage arcade game booth. In a dimly lit room, users are greeted by the Dealer, who invites them to play a simple card game. As participants choose between two cards presented by floating white hands, their decisions shape the narrative and reveal insights into their character. This engaging format encourages reflection on choice and consequence, inviting viewers to explore the interplay between chance and self-discovery in a playful, immersive environment.



"Bad Outcomes" is an interactive video experience that invites visitors to engage with the topic of mental health uniquely. By lifting a telephone handle, viewers trigger a random video that presents five visual cycles of failed suicide attempts, reimagined with humour and hope. This project uses photography and videography to illustrate how challenging experiences can lead to unexpected growth and reflection. By addressing suicide with satire, it aims to normalise discussions around mental health, reduce stigma, and inspire renewal through resilience.

"Connection and Isolation" is a powerful photography project that captures the emotional complexity of human experience through stunning portraits. 



DIO PEREIRA







This graduation exhibition and film screening illustrate how media, arts and technology integrate with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGS), in keeping with the spirit of "Every 1" in USJ Macao, which celebrates variety and common humanity.

In this exhibition, students use their creative works to illustrate the power of creativity in raising awareness and inspiring action for a more sustainable future. Many projects highlight topics supporting SDG 4 - Quality Education - such as self-discovery, learning, and the search for meaning. Individual and community well-being is addressed in accordance with SDG 3 - Good Health and Well-being - covering topics such as mental health, emotional complexity, and resilience. Some works reflect SDG 10 - Reduced Inequalities - by shedding light on the lives of ethnic minorities and

advocating for underrepresented groups and abilities. Issues such as SDG 5 - Gender Equality - breaking stereotypes and encouraging freedom of speech are also discussed. The use of new technologies is linked to SDG 9 - Industry, Innovation, and Infrastructure but reflections on social pressures are related to SDG 8 - Decent Work and Economic Growth. Raising awareness of Macao's biodiversity helps to achieve SDG 15 - Life on Land. Furthermore, various projects are supporting SDG 13 - Climate Action - demonstrating a knowledge of interconnection and the artist's desire to contribute to global goals. The exhibition offers a dynamic engagement with important global challenges, showcasing how artistic expression can make a significant contribution to the worldwide pursuit of the SDGS. The Exhibition also follows the 3Rs, Reduce, Reuse, Recycle strategies.
